WORSHIP MINISTRY

SELECTION PROCESS

The worship team is usually comprised of 2-4 vocalists, SAT. Each individual must be exemplary in character and in dedication to this ministry. The ideal candidate would be a member of Grace Fellowship have the ability to harmonize naturally without effort. Those selected to be a part of this ministry group must faithfully attend all rehearsals and be diligent to the cause of the Worship Ministry Department.

Note: A friendly reminder email will be given to you during the week of your performance.

EXPECTATIONS

Each member must be prompt and ready to minister for each service. Criteria are as follows:

1. Rehearsals -Tuesday at 7pm – 9pm and Sundays at 8am – 9am

Every three months members of the worship team will be given a worship calendar (shown below). It will let you know what Sunday you are to participate and whom you will be participating with. If for some reason you cannot make it to a rehearsal or on Sunday morning, please contact Pastor Jonathan beforehand so he can make any adjustments if necessary. We realize that life happens and there may be occasions you might not be able to show. Because of this we have adopted a very flexible approach that allows us to ebb and flow with the situation. WORSHIP MINISTRY (continued)

2. <u>Servanthood</u> – At Grace we don't consider being a servant to the Most High a light endeavor. Being involved in ministry continually teaches us why it is such a privilege and honor to be used by God. Being a servant (in every sense of the word) means that we take care of God's house and God's people <u>God's way</u> and not our own.

At times, it can be a struggle to be a "real servant" and put away our flesh. At Grace we realize this. But please understand that God honors our commitment to servanthood. Because in our efforts to become true servants, we realize more and more that what we do is not about us, it's about winning souls for God. And once, we realize this fact being a servant becomes a high, high calling. Please review the following servanthood bullets.

- Being a servant means: we have a servant's heart. We put others needs above our own and work together to achieve the best aspects of worship ministry.
- Being a servant means: being on time and holding to the commitment you gave initially.
- Being a servant means: Focusing on the task at hand and doing your absolute best, always, to complete it.

RE: Issues that arise:

- Being a servant means that we don't handle our issues, problems, or conflict in the conventional way the world does. Please know that our leadership team will do their best to handle these situations in a Godly manner as they arise. But it's your job to make sure that when problems do come, and you decide to make them known; that you are making them known for the bennifit of everybody and not because you got your feelings hurt.
- Being a servant means that we have patience with decisions that are made. Inevitably, situations like this may come along at some point and there may be disagreements among members of the team. If this happens, deny your flesh, and make sure you do not have an argumentative Spirit. This way we can resolve the issue swiftly and continue focusing on the mission of the team.
- **3.** <u>Interview Process and Auditions</u> If you are joining the Worship Ministry Department on any level you will need to schedule an interview time during the week Monday through Thursday with our Worship Pastor Jonathan Casas. The process of joining is three-fold:

• INTERVIEW AND SKILL LEVEL TESTING

This is a necessary step in evaluating your anointing in this area. We all have different anointing and gifting. Just because a person can sing does not mean that God has given that person a gift. There are many gifts that God can give a person that can be used and are essential to the Ministries of Grace Fellowship. Such as, gifts in administration and organization, sound reinforcement, communication, etc. Fortunately, musicianship and vocalization are gifts that can grow and can be taught. Therefore, there will always be a place for even the novice somewhere in the Worship Ministry. However, Godly anointing can not be taught. It is a gift that solely comes from the Father and is sovereign in nature and selection. This interview will help determine your "Worship Ministry nitch".

• INTERIM TIME WITH THE TEAM (USUALLY 3 TO 6 WEEKS)

This is also a necessary step to see how you function in our group setting. How well you take and receive instruction is vital to fulfilling our team's goals and to reach and save the lost. It is also a good time to get the lay of the land, ask questions and get familiar by fellowshipping with one another.

• POLICY AND PROCEDURE/CONTRACT INFROMATION

The Policy and Procedure Manual are here to answer most of the questions you might have regarding anything Worship Ministry related. Please read it thoroughly and if you have any questions please contact our Worship Pastor, Jonathan Casas for more information. Also, please fill out the questionnaire and contract at the end and return it to the Worship Pastors office within two weeks of receipt.

Lastly, the contract is an agreement between you and Grace Fellowship and our Worship Pastor. It was designed to make it abundantly clear what you are agreeing to. Please make sure you understand everything on it before signing. Pastor Jonathan can answer any questions you might have.

- 4. <u>Attire</u> —Please be neat in appearance. Wearing upper casual is a good key to make us all match. Ladies should wear nice pants or dresses on performance days. If wearing a dress, please make sure that your skirt comes at least to the knee. Shoulders should be covered as well. Rehearsals (of course) are more casual. Men, no T-shirts with logos on performance days and no shorts. Jeans are ok, but no holes. Thank you in advance for your participation in this area. If we are faithful in the little things God will bless us with much.
- 5. <u>Spiritual Maturity</u> In our congregation, we have several denominations worshiping together. This allows for differing views on the Holy Spirit and His work in the corporate setting of the church. High importance is placed upon the spiritual maturity of each individual. There must be a freedom in your worship style. You must be unhindered in praising the Lord by the raising of hands and having the ability to praise the Lord without the thought of "somebody is watching me." At the same time, you should be alright with someone being more reserved on stage. All of us should have a consistent prayer-life, as well as personal devotional time in the Word.
- 6. <u>Faithfulness</u> This is a leadership position that calls for the highest commitment. People not only look to our worship team for leadership, but they also look to you, as an individual as well. Sometimes, you may not feel like worshiping the Lord for whatever reason. Maybe your too tired to come to practice, or you've had a long, hard work week and come Sunday you just want to be lazy and skip it.... Please note that feelings are not to be lived by nor should they prevent us from worshiping the Lord. Our service is unto the Lord Most High. We serve at His good pleasure.

In instance of sickness, please call Pastor Jonathan as far ahead of time as possible.

7. <u>Preparedness</u> - I cannot express to you enough how important it is to worship God all week long. Please be aware that you are coming into a powerful time of praise when we worship our Lord. There's no bigger distraction than one of the team members bringing his or her "baggage" into that environment. If, for some reason you are going through a tough time in your life and feel like you are unable to worship God in an honest way, then please don't. Feel free to "sit this one out" or take a break from worship until you are right. If you are comfortable, please tell someone on the team if you need prayer or assistance. We aren't only here to praise and bring worship to God, but we are a team and a family that needs to be there for one another.

Note: Pastor Jonathan has asked several members of our congregation to hold us up in prayer. Every week there are many people who are praying for us and our situations. God is good and you may feel His intercession.

SPECIAL MUSIC

Grace believes that music is one of the main keys to the preparation of the heart for the Word of God. It is our utmost purpose and desire that all musical presentations: choral, solos, duets, band numbers, etc. represent the Lord with a heart after Him, to please the Lord first, and thereby, move the heart of His people. The following is a list of guidelines to be followed in the area of special musical ministry.

VOCAL

- 1. All songs are to be pre-approved. Schedule a time with Pastor Jonathan to preview your song. This will also afford you the chance to get last minute help (if needed). The main reason for previewing the music is to have another person confirm that the music fits in with the direction and style of our services.
- 2. All solos, duets, trios, etc. will be selected from those who are part of the Worship Ministry at Grace Fellowship. This helps reinforce our teamwork philosophy. Occasionally we will have people from outside perform special music; however, these people will be auditioned as to ensure a quality performance.
- 3. All sound checks are as follows: Please arrive early: Sunday Morning by 9:45 a.m.

Please note: We prefer to have live music during your performance. However, if MP3 files or CDs are used, they need to be given to the sound tech before your sound check at 9:45.

- 4. If you fail to meet your sound check time, be aware that levels of music and "EQ's" will not be at their optimal. Remember, plan to be early. You will arrive during the worship team rehearsal. But this will help with any unforeseen interruptions. Please try to memorize your music. You can minister more effectively with your eyes and voice rather than your voice alone.
- 5. Please limit your ministry to the song. Testimonies are great; however, your song selection alone should be able to speak your heart. If you would like to make an exception, please notify Pastor Jonathan before Sunday so we can run it by the office staff to make the necessary adjustments to the service plan timeline and the sound technicians. There may not be enough time for your testimony inside the service.
- 6. Please maintain a ready position. Be aware that as the Holy Spirit moves our services may take different directions and a restructuring of the service takes place that may move your song selection to a different position in the service. To allow for this, please sit nearer to the front row when performing. Know which mic you are going to be using and if possible, have it with you while you wait for the special music time.

Please have your accompanist ready as well (if applicable). This will ensure proper balances, etc. for the service.

ATTIRE

Performing special music is an honor and a privilege. Please be neat in appearance. Upper casual is the key. Ladies performing should wear nice clothing on Sunday mornings. If wearing a dress, please make sure that your skirt comes at least to the knee. Shoulders should be covered as well. Men should wear nice pants and a nice shirt. No logo's please. If you have any further questions, please contact Pastor Jonathan.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

QUESTION: What should I bring to rehearsal?

ANSWER: Pen/pencil, tape recorder (A REAL MUST), sheet music (if handed out), prayer requests.

QUESTION: What if I can't make a rehearsal?

ANSWER: Contact Pastor Jonathan. It is very important to know who will be on the team for any service.

QUESTION: Who do I talk to if I have a problem with another person on the team?

ANSWER: First, go to the person with whom you are having a problem. If you cannot resolve the problem, go to your team leader. If you are still unable to resolve the issue, you may need help from our Pastors, or Elders.

QUESTION: What do I do if I'm interested in soloing?

ANSWER: If you are interested in soloing, the best thing to do is let Jonathan know. We can then set up a quick audition with a worship song, or music that you have that you feel best demonstrates your vocal quality and style. This will help us know your heart and vocal style when considering you for a solo.

A WORD ABOUT COMMITMENT

Being involved in the Worship Ministry presents a unique opportunity to serve Grace Fellowship. God has called you not only to minister on a regular basis to the entire church, but also to be an example in behavior and character to fellow believers. Setting a good example in thought, word, and deed involves several different things such as growing in Christ, responding to others in love and sharing the gospel with unbelievers. Another way to set a good example is by fulfilling your commitments, especially when it comes to ministry. Consequently, it is hoped that everyone who has joined the Worship Ministry department will be able to attend at least 80% of the performances and rehearsals.

Of course, emergencies and unforeseen circumstances often arise. These will certainly be taken into consideration when evaluating your attendance record. After all, we are under grace, rather than under the law. So don't panic! Have a great time in serving the Lord. Just bear in mind that following through with your commitment to this ministry is part of ministering to the needs of God's people and setting an example for them, especially the children. Being faithful to your worship ministry commitment can be just as important as your personal testimony or your musical abilities.

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

Although we strive to make a causal atmosphere, there are some standards that we'd like to adhere to together as a team. The main idea is to minimize the distractions that break people away from worshiping. Believe it or not, if the team onstage does not look somewhat uniform, people might take notice, if only in their subconscious. If this happens, even for an instant, we take control away from what the Holy Spirit is working on at that moment. It is our desire to do what we can to minimize this from happening. God is in the details, and He will bless us for this.

Also, no ministry is more important than any other ministry in God's eyes, servants in the Worship Ministry tend to be scrutinized longer and harder by the public because they are so visible. In other words, you're ON STAGE! Consequently, you need to set a higher standard, especially in one specific area of human expression: how we dress. The key words regarding this issue are sensitivity and modesty. Here is an important reminder: Clothes that may be conservative in the world's eyes might still not be modest enough for church. To help you cultivate self-awareness in this sometimes-confusing arena of Christian freedom (dress/style), we have provided the following guidelines that Worship Ministry team leaders will do our best to make sure are being followed. These guidelines apply to all music ministers (vocal and instrumental) and are VERY IMPORTANT!

LIFE COMMITMENT

- Be understanding of people who serve next to you in ministry.
- Be patient with other ministry teams.
- Be supportive of each other and care for one another.

3. CLEANLINESS

- Regularly clean up after yourselves.
- Eliminate clutter and garbage from workspace.
- Streamline your time to complete the task at hand.

TIME COMMITMENT

You are committing to be on time for rehearsals, special events and performances. There should be no excuses for fall out other than work, vacation, or injury. We know God sometimes makes shifts in ministry and we as Pastors are committed that we don't overtax you in your areas of ministry. If God urges you to move on from the Worship Ministry department, we'd ask that you give us three weeks notice so that we aren't left in the lurch of trying to find a replacement for you.

I understand the Life, Leadership, and Time commitments that are required to participate in the Worship Ministry and joyfully commit to them.
