
while slowly gathering nutrients from the soil. Each season represents growth, dormancy, challenges and time.

Paul wrote, "Do not grow weary in doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up" (Gal 6:9). "O taste and see that the Lord is good" (Ps. 34:8). How true this verse is. For anyone who gets a taste of the goodness of God, it is an unforgettable experience.

He never disappoints. He is always good. The hungry, needy, searching, and empty soul that gets a taste of the kindness of God, the love of God, the grace and mercy of God, the faithfulness of God, the thoughtfulness of God, and the care of God—that person will always find that taste to be good!

And with that in mind, the Bible tells us that

Jesus is the vine and we are His branches, and we are to bear fruit (John 15:1-11). It is most often from the fruit of our lives that people get a taste of God.

So, when we are in the presence of others, they get a taste of who we are and who God is! As we interact with others, as we respond and react, as we speak and

as we act, the fruit of our lives is on display.

People are getting a taste of the fruit that comes from a branch that is connected to the Vine,

Christ Himself. And when they get that taste from the fruit of our lives, does it cause them to respond with wonder at how good it tastes?

I remember attending a memorial service of a dear friend. Johnny Trimmer was a great talent. He had the voice of an angel. We led hymn sings together. He would sing and I would accompany him on the organ. The officiator of his service asked the crowd if Johnny exhibited certain traits in his life. These traits were none other than the 9 qualities found in Galatians 5:22. "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control". The memorial service was an amazing experience for me because as the Pastor stated each trait, the crowd acknowledged in the positive. I was moved by this. Here was a man, that if you knew him, it was easy to confirm the fruits in his life. They were so clearly visible! And, what an honor to

have the final thoughts of you be an affirmation of the fruits of the spirit! Because of this experience I will always remember him in the best way possible. A man who bore good fruit.

Ministry is also a place where we need good fruit. Sometimes we can assume that our leadership bears no bad fruit. We look to our leaders and pastors to be Godly examples. But as one of your pastors, I can safely say that we are only human. We live under the same mercies that renew themselves every morning

(Lam. 3:22-23). Every Pastor, as he hears his call, will only ever be "simply human". We have all made many mistakes along the way with the potential for many more to come. mistakes are made, that they are minor and have small impact.


In our humanity we struggle. "But blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him." (Jer. 17:7)







Stir in consomme, water and sherry.

Bring to boiling, lower heat, simmer, covered 25 minutes or until all liquid is absorbed.

Add cheese. Stir gently but well.

I usually double the recipe or order to have leftovers as it is delicious "leftover".



TRUTH OVER TRIBE

Can we be people of conviction without fracturing our families, ending friendships and splitting churches? If you feel exhausted by tribalism and divisions, you may be



tribalism and divisions, you may be encouraged by this book.

In part 1, "How Tribalism Hurts You," the authors show clearly how tribalism (us versus them mentality) —evangelical or some other kind—ruins relationships, increases anxiety, incentivizes inauthenticity, creates enemies, and blinds us.

Part 2, which shows why Facebook feeds of "personal truths" encourage tribalism, might have material that will be new to many. For example, Miller and Simon show how algorithms of the Big Tech company Meta—owner of Facebook, Instagram, and WhatsApp—deliberately emphasize divisiveness to gain user attention and increase time on those platforms, which makes them more attractive to advertisers.

Part 3 encourages us to show generosity and kindness, cross tribal lines, and listen better.

"In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity."

How do we decide what's so compelling that a Christian would speak up? When we're pressured to bow down and put some other god before God, we must be ready to enter the fiery furnace, as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were in chapter 3 of Daniel. But what about situations that aren't as intense?

I encourage you to read this book if you feel like a political orphan. If the title is off-putting, I also encourage you to read this book, as stretching ourselves beyond our comforts is essential. While I didn't love everything in this book, I learned a lot. - Cierra Pera

Operation Christmas Child The Greatest Journey in Mongolia

Buyankhishig, a church leader says "Light, sky, land, and water appeared out of nothing. Next came vegetation, animals, and mankind. God called forth all these things simply by speaking: Let there be ..." (Genesis 1) While the story of creation may sound familiar, it is an entirely new concept for many boys and girls in Mongolia. At Living Stone Church in Nalaikh, just an hour's drive outside of the capital of Ulaanbaatar, children are hearing this amazing Bible story and many others through The Greatest Journey. Each of the 12 lessons proclaims Good News that confronts commonly held secular and animistic world views in Mongolia. The first class on creation is particularly revolutionary.







Buyankhishig continues: "The first lesson is always exciting for me to teach, because it is a very different idea that the world was created by God. Mongolia was a communist country, and Darwin's theory was taught - that our origin is from a monkey." The truth from God's word is sticking in the minds of the boys and girls who join the program. Munkhbold, 11, and Enkhriilen, 9, were among children who received Christ into their lives during The Greatest Journey course at Living Stone Church in Nalaikh, Mongolia. Munkhbold had attended church for seven years before he enrolled in the discipleship lessons, but the 12 Bible stories became the tool God used to change his life. Now he is bringing his four younger sisters to Sunday school and also telling his classmates, friends, and neighbors about Jesus. They are also sharing God's Word with the parents.

The Family Zone






