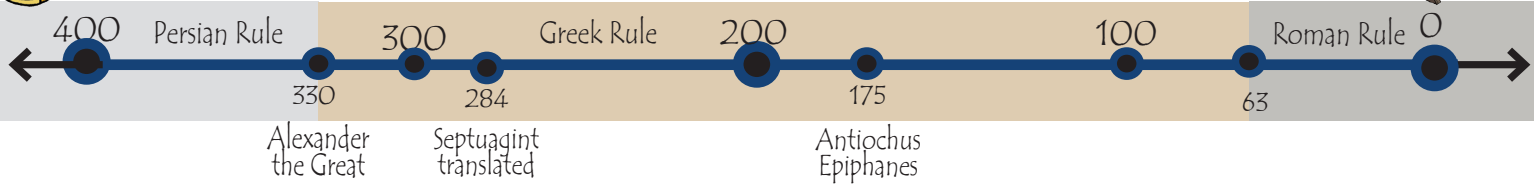

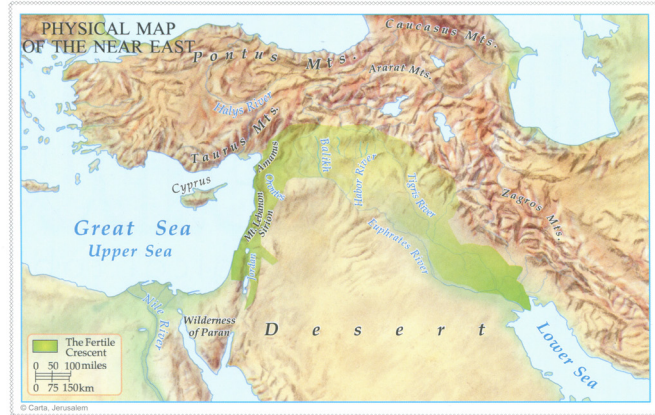

1. Was conditional (by necessity)
 2. Was external
 3. Purpose
 4. Was national
 5. Pictured redemption - brought out of slavery
 6. Ratified with blood
 7. "Rolled forward" sins
 8. Requires obedience
 9. Promises

- The New Covenant
1. Is unconditional
 2. Is internal
 3. Purpose
 4. Is personal
 5. Accomplished Redemption
 6. Ratified with blood
 7. Forgiveness of sins
 8. Provides obedience
 9. Better Promises
