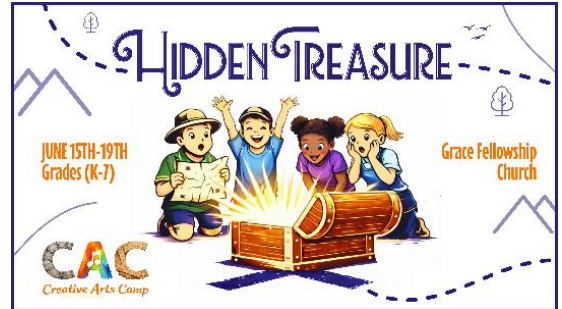


COURSE CATALOG

We are thrilled you are planning to register your child to attend the 6th annual Creative Arts Camp brought to you by Grace Fellowship Church in Jackson and The Call Church in Pine Grove!

- Two classes are assigned to each **Junior** and **Varsity** camper. **Juniors** are kids entering grades 1-3 and **Varsity** are kids entering grades 4-7 in the fall of 2026.
- **Kindergarten** campers attend two mixed media classes designed for this age group, so selecting classes is not necessary.



This camp fills up fast and you will want to be prepared to answer all questions during registration, so please read the **Registration Tips** below before online registration opens.

IMPORTANT: If your child is registered and then is unable to attend, please let us know so we might be able to arrange for a child on the waitlist to attend. Thank you for your cooperation.

REGISTRATION TIPS

1. If this is your first time registering, you will be required to create a login and password. You may use your email address or cell phone number for your login ID.
2. If you have registered your child for camp before, their name is in our database. Start typing your child's first or last name in the name field and select from the list. Create a new person only if you've never entered your child's name into the registration program before.
3. The cost this year is \$30 per child, \$60 for two, and \$80 max for more children in the same household. You will be prompted to pay by credit card or debit card at the end of registration.
Note: Scholarships are available. If you need help with the tuition, check Yes when prompted and then enter the discount code "SR" (for "Scholarship Request") when you are prompted to pay.
4. For "Medical notes," identify anything we need to be aware of, especially food allergies.
5. Each camper will receive a T-Shirt, so you will need to select the size for each child. Options range from Youth XS to Adult L.
6. You will need to identify anyone who is authorized to pick up your child. Children will not be released to anyone who has not been pre-authorized.
Note: A photo ID is required to pick up a child, so please be prepared and advise others who will be picking up on your behalf.
7. You can identify one other parent to receive email messages about camp.
8. For Junior and Varsity campers, review **Course Electives** beginning on page 2 with your child, and select 6 courses; then rank them in order of preference (1st choice to 6th choice).
Our [Registrations Preparation Worksheet](#) is designed to help you remember their choices as you enter them into the Course Electives form when you register.
Note: Class sizes are limited, so please encourage your children to try something new. Every effort is made to enroll children in their top choices; however, some classes are held during the same class session or fill quickly, which is why we ask for 6 choices.

9. When you reach the confirmation page, you will need to open a form for each Junior and Varsity camper and identify their 6 course electives and click **Submit**. The links look like this:

A green checkmark (✓) appears after the form is submitted. (You may need to refresh the page to see the checkmark appear.)

IMPORTANT: A confirmation email is sent to you **BEFORE** you submitted any required forms, so the message will say that forms are incomplete. You will receive separate emails for each form you submit. **DO NOT SUBMIT DUPLICATE FORMS.** Please check your email first or click the **View registration** button in your registration confirmation message. If a green checkmark appears next to the form on the registration details page, you're good!

COURSE ELECTIVES

AVAILABLE FOR JUNIORS ONLY

Cake & Cookie Decorating (Juniors)

Have you ever looked in the window of a bakery and wondered how they make those fancy cakes? Well, this is the class for you - The Art of Cake and Cookie Decorating! In this class we'll be working with two different kinds of frosting, learn how to use piping bags, and decorate with various tips and colors. We'll learn several fun borders, how to make flowers and leaves, and even write with frosting. We'll practice the skills, and then design and decorate cupcakes and cookies. We'll finish the week with a beautifully decorated cake that would rival any bakery. So, if you love those fancy cakes, sign up for this class!

Culinary Arts (Juniors)

In this yummy class, we will be cooking our way around the world! We will be whipping up tasty treats that are simple and fun, sweet and savory. Campers will learn about measuring and kitchen tools, and by the end of the week they will come away with some goodies and a recipe book of favorite treats.

Mixed Media (Juniors)

If you just can't decide which kind of art class you want to take, try Mixed Media. In this class, we will be making several different kinds of art, from paper crafts to painting to clay, and more. So, if you want to try it all, Mixed Media is the class for you!

AVAILABLE FOR JUNIORS & VARSITY

Note: Junior and Varsity campers do not attend the same class; rather, classes are offered in different sessions, one for Juniors and another for Varsity.

Ceramics (Juniors & Varsity)

Get ready to get your hands dirty! In this class we will create pinch or coil pots like the ancients did, make a stamp, explore slab or tile work, carve words and designs in clay tiles, and create sculptures. Pieces will be displayed "green" at our Friday Night Showcase but will be professionally fired and glazed after that so you will get these masterpieces back ... a beautiful transformation!

Note: After camp ends, these crafts will be fired, glazed, and fired again, which takes time. You will receive a message as soon as these crafts are ready to pick up.

Dance (Juniors & Varsity)

This class will provide fundamentals of jazz and modern technique for beginners and how dance can be used in worship, praise, and ministry. Campers will learn some general dance vocabulary, technical warm-up exercises, center floor sequences and cross-the-floor drills. Health and safety are emphasized while stretching and trying new tricks like spins, leaps, and balancing. We will explore musicality, choreography and improvisation and how they can be utilized at any skill level of choreographed praise, spontaneous worship, or storytelling ministry. Both classes will participate in a combined presentation to showcase learned choreography, their own creative sequences, and spontaneous worship.

Drama (Juniors & Varsity)

Aaaand...Action! Our drama class will perform the final evening's on-stage skit. Campers must have the ability to read a script. Campers will learn expression, voice projection, and stage presence. Direction is also an important life skill! The drama is a simple and fun production tied into the week's theme and is an excellent introduction to the world of acting, as well as a huge confidence booster.

Drawing & Cartooning (Juniors & Varsity)

Do you like cartoons and comics? Then drawing and cartooning is perfect for visually expressing your imagination! You will learn the building blocks of drawing and illustrating. Your imagination will be the key to having fun in this course.

Engineering (Juniors & Varsity)

Are you interested in learning how to design and build machines? Then, this is the class for you! In Engineering we are going to learn the science of cause and effect, motion and force, and the basic mechanics of physics. We'll be working with pulleys, inclined planes, wheels and axles, levers, wedges, screws, along with many other components. We'll discover how the transfer of energy works, how

friction interacts, and how to use the forces of gravity. If you'd like to design a machine, diagram its sections, calculate the energy required, predict the outcome, build it, test it, and then demonstrate your invention to others, then you'll love this class!

Fitness (Juniors & Varsity) – **New**

Do you want to be motivated and faithful? In this energetic fitness class, campers will discover how faith and movement work together to keep both body and spirit strong! Through fun exercises, team challenges, and active games, campers will learn the importance of perseverance and trust in God. Each activity is paired with uplifting Bible verses like Philippians 4:13 ("I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me") and Hebrews 12:1 ("Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us"), reminding every child to stay motivated, faithful, and full of joy as they move for the glory of God.

Illusions (Juniors & Varsity)

Alacazam! "How did you do that?!" are words you will hear again and again when you learn how to amaze your family and friends in this exciting and fun-filled course, where you will embark on a journey into the art of illusion. The course is designed to introduce campers to the study of magic as a performance art and some of the different styles and techniques used by magicians. The course will cover some of the basic principles of illusion, including sleight of hand, misdirection, and audience management. Campers will learn how to perform classic magic tricks, and how to create their own props that will allow them to puzzle and bewilder their audiences. Throughout the course, campers will have the opportunity to practice their skills and receive feedback from their peers and instructor. They will learn how to refine their technique and learn that, like in any art, the path to perfect their performance is through building confidence through practice and discipline. By the end of the course, campers will have a repertoire of magic effects that they create and practice (yes, there are arts and crafts involved!) to showcase their skills in a magic show to entertain and amaze audiences of all ages!

Jewelry (Juniors & Varsity)

In this class, you will learn several different jewelry-making techniques as you create finished pieces to keep. You will learn basic wire-wrapping, various knotting styles and their purposes, and how to use findings in the design and completion of your projects. Each camper will be able to create several lovely items to keep or give to someone special!

Leather Craft (Juniors & Varsity)

Our leather craft class will cover the basics of leather stitching, tooling and dyeing. You will be able to create items and skills that will last a lifetime. We will carefully design and assemble projects using real leather and a variety of specialized tools. By the end of the week, you will go home with pieces to keep for yourself, or you can gift your craft to someone who will cherish all your hard work.

Martial Arts (Juniors & Varsity)

Join us for a mixed martial arts class, where you will learn a combination of self-defense techniques as well as some fun ways to fall and roll without getting hurt. In this class you will learn the value of self-control and be challenged to grow both physically – through physical exercise and self-defense practice – as well as spiritually by emphasizing the Bible verses you will be learning at camp!

Paper Creations (Juniors & Varsity) – **New**

This hands-on class invites campers to explore the art and possibilities of paper through fun, creative projects. Campers will learn the fundamentals of origami and paper airplane design, while also experimenting with a variety of other paper crafts such as folding, cutting, and sculpting. The course encourages creativity, problem-solving, and attention to detail as campers transform simple sheets of paper into imaginative works of art. No prior experience is needed—just curiosity and a willingness to create!

Printmaking (Juniors & Varsity) – **New!**

This class will explore different types of printmaking using various materials such as printing ink, markers, paint, rubber fish, Legos, vegetables, and foam plates. You will be doing foam prints, Gytaku/fish prints, collagraph prints, and mono prints. Come prepared to make messes and learn new things!

Tie Dye (Juniors & Varsity)

Tie-dye is a vibrant art form that involves folding, twisting, or tying fabric before applying dye, creating unique patterns and colors. This resist-dyeing technique prevents dye from reaching certain areas of the fabric, resulting in distinctive designs. This is a fun art activity making colorful patterns on fabric like T-shirts or pillowcases. Lots of Fun and can get quite messy.

Note: Please bring two new white shirts to transform into color during this class.

Voice (Juniors & Varsity)

Come enjoy learning the foundations of voice—God’s design for you as a singer—and how to be a vocal athlete. We will teach you warming up, posture, breathing, dynamics and other skills... Discover simple techniques that will help you grow as a singer and preserve your voice for years to come.

AVAILABLE FOR VARSITY ONLY

Culinary Arts (Varsity)

In this yummy class, we will be cooking our way around the world by whipping up tasty treats that are simple and fun, sweet and savory. The kids will learn about cutting, measuring, and kitchen tools, and by the end of the week they will come away with some goodies and a recipe book of favorite treats. From elegant to effortless, we will enjoy this experience together!

Fabric Arts (Varsity)

In Fabric Arts we will make simple fabric items that are fun and appropriate for each artist’s skill level. We will learn about different types of fabric and their best use. What’s a pattern? Measuring, marking, and other general sewing terms will help prepare young needle crafters to begin their own sewing journey. There will be a variety of creative projects to choose from.

Fly Fishing (Varsity)

In this class, campers will dive into the world of fly fishing! They will make personalized fly-fishing lanyards and their own flies, including wooly buggers, pheasant tail nymphs, and chironomids, all on barbless hooks (we can also remove the tips if a parent prefers). Campers will also learn knot tying, fly rod assembly, and fly casting. The kids will come home with their flies, rope, educational coloring book, lanyard, laminated information pages, and the Varsity crafter will receive a fly-fishing tool kit!

Soap Making (Varsity)

This class will teach the basics on how to make soap using the easy and safe melt-and-pour method. Campers will learn to melt and pour a premade soap bases, which doesn’t require lye, into different shaped molds, how to add fragrance, and how to cut fun and colorful shapes to add to their soap.

Welding (Varsity)

Fire up your torches! This activity will teach you the safety rules and the techniques required to weld pieces of metal. You will create fun projects using these newly developed skills, whether yard art or functional yet artistic household items! Welding is a lot of fun and a skill you can use all your life. It can also become a well-paying career!

Note: Please come wearing long pants (not shorts) and close-toed shoes. Thank you!

Wood Arts (Varsity)

Creating artwork on wood is a unique form of artistic expression. With such tools as pens, ink, stamping, drawing, paint pens, and wood burning, we’ll be putting our designs on wood. We’ll be working with beads, leather, and split rings, and we’ll learn stitching, gluing, and drilling. Then we’ll give it a professional touch with finishing skills, such as sanding, stains, and varnishes. Some of our projects include inspirational refrigerator magnets and plaques, wooden cross pendants for necklaces, even personalized walking and hiking sticks. Come and explore artistry on wood in our creative Wood Arts class.

Note: Please bring your own special stick that we can transform into a walking or hiking stick!

Woodworking (Varsity)

It is our desire that a love for Woodworking design and development be kindled in the youth of our community. Hobby woodworking is a lifelong endeavor that develops focus of mind, satisfaction of heart, self-confidence, and pride in craftsmanship. Age-appropriate projects will be cut, assembled, and finished using an assortment of hand and power tools. Safety is always of primary concern. Our time together will include instruction and the constant watchful eye of several experienced woodworkers as your child learns proper usage of these tools. We hope to see you in our class.
